
INTRODUCTION

- Who do we go to first when we have a problem: the bank loan officer, the medicine cabinet, food & drink, or God?
- When is it godly to be bullheaded and stubborn?

Passage	Comments
2Kings 1:1-18	<p>The lesson of King Ahaziah</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • v3. ‘Is it because there is no God in Israel that you go to inquire of another god?’ <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ♦ How often do people seek help from other sources before they seek God’s help (e.g., bank loans, alcohol, drugs, gambling...) ♦ We should all learn to seek God’s remedy
2:1-25	<p>Elishah’s Boldness – ‘Give me a Double Portion’</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • vv6-11. Elisha is bullheaded about not leaving Elijah and ends up receiving twice the power (see comparison table of miracles to the right →) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ♦ Are there just reasons to be stubborn and bullheaded? .. e.g., ‘be not weary in well doing’ • vv23-24. Teenagers were unruly even then. Lesson to learn - Never seek to harm a man of God. Judgment will come sooner or later
3:1-27	<p>The Enemy of My Enemy is My Friend</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The kings of Judah (Jehoshaphat) and Israel (Jehoram) unite to combat Moab • vv11-19. Jehoshaphat wants confirmation from Elisha on whether or not to fight Moab <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ♦ v15. Music was not used as a magical elixir, but probably was used to soothe Elisha’s mental state to better focus on hearing God much like we use music for thoughtful worship
4:1-44	<p>Elisha’s Miracles</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jars of oil and poison stew are on the menu • Shunammite woman receives a child and Elisha performs a resurrection on the child • vv42-44 – Principle of where to tithe when your church is wicked. It seems OK to give your tithe to another godly source. Here a man brings his tithe (per God’s directive) to feed the people
5:1-27	<p>Naaman’s leprosy causes him to accept God</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • vv9-10. Elisha doesn’t give Naaman due respect, but tells him go wash 7x in the Jordan river • Naaman’s belligerent attitude almost prevented him from getting healed, but he had a habit of heeding good advice from others (1st his slave girl, then his servant) – and so should we • v17-19 Naaman commits himself to God – BUT he had to continue living in a godless nation, and Elisha’s comment “go in peace” conveyed God’s forbearance with Naaman’s situation
