Ecc1 11:1-6	<p><b>Invest in Life</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• vv1-2,6. “Cast your bread on many waters” and “Divide your portion to 7 or 8” and “sow your seed in the morning and evening” are good advice to diversify                     <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>♦ Playing it safe is not always a good option</li> <li>♦ Yet, Christians can have hope in God’s providential care – assuming they are obedient and faithful</li> </ul> </li> <li>♦ <b>Right Attitudes &amp; Motives on Money</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Meet Needs of Family ..... 1 Tim 5:8</li> <li>2. Further the Gospel ..... Phil 4:14-18</li> <li>3. Care for the Poor ..... Pr 19:17; Mat 19:21</li> <li>4. Give More ..... Seven Things Worth More Than Money	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. <b>God’s Love:</b> Psalm 63:3 Thy lovingkindness is better than life</li> <li>2. <b>God’s Word:</b> Psalm 119:72 The law of thy mouth is better unto me than thousands of gold and silver (cf Job 23:12; Ps 119:127)</li> <li>3. <b>Wisdom:</b> Pr 3:13 - 15 Happy is the man that finds wisdom, and the man that gets understanding. For [she] is better than the merchandise of silver, and the gain thereof than fine gold. She is more precious than rubies (also see Pr 16:16)</li> <li>4. <b>Friendship:</b> Pr 15:17 Better is a dinner of herbs where love is, than a stalled ox and hatred therewith</li> <li>5. <b>Reputation:</b> Pr 22:1 A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches, and loving favor rather than silver and gold</li> <li>6. <b>Integrity:</b> Pr 23:23 Buy the truth, and sell it not; also wisdom, and instruction, and understanding</li> <li>7. <b>Christ’s Reproach:</b> Heb 11:26 Moses esteemed the reproach of Christ as greater riches than the treasures in Egypt</li> </ul>

Passage	Comments
11:7-10	<p><b>Know the Boundaries</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• v9. “Follow the impulses of your heart”. Fortunately, Solomon stipulates when one follows their “gut instincts” or the lust of their eyes, God will judge</li> <li>• v10. “Remove grief and anger from your heart and put away pain from your body for time is short”             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>♦ GREAT advice to grow up, act responsibly, stop causing self-inflicted wounds (e.g., drugs, alcohol...)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
12:1-8	<p><b>Remember Your Creator While Young</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• It’s a shame so many waste their youth on partying</li> <li>• These phrases are difficult to interpret, but the overall message is clear: the body is deteriorating over time             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>♦ v2. Sun, moon, stars are dark, &amp; clouds everywhere – Probably refers to vision problems of old age</li> <li>♦ v3a. <i>Keepers of the house trembles</i> – Possibly arms and hands are not as strong as they use to be</li> <li>♦ v3b. <i>Mighty men stoop</i> – Knees, hips &amp; back fail</li> <li>♦ v3c. <i>Grinding ones stand idle</i> – Loss of teeth</li> <li>♦ v3d. <i>Windows grow dim</i> – Again, vision problems</li> <li>♦ v4a. <i>Doors are shut</i> – No interest to go anywhere</li> <li>♦ v4b. <i>Sound of the grinding mill is low</i> – Going deaf</li> <li>♦ v4c. <i>Arise at the sound of a bird</i> – Can’t sleep</li> <li>♦ v4d. <i>Soft singing</i> – Voice can no longer hold a note</li> <li>♦ v5a. <i>Fear of heights and terrors</i> – Fear of falling</li> <li>♦ v5b. <i>Almond tree blossoms</i> – White hair takes over</li> <li>♦ v5c. <i>Grasshopper drags himself</i> - Need help walking</li> <li>♦ v5d. <i>Caperberry fails</i> – Sexual desire wanes (caper berries were/are an aphrodisiac)</li> <li>♦ v6a. <i>Silver Cord and Golden Bowl are Broken</i> – Possible allusion to problems with the Brain (memory loss) and Nervous system (shakes)</li> <li>♦ v6b. <i>Pitcher by the well shattered and the wheel at the cistern is crushed</i> – Matthew Poole commentary speculates problems with the heart/blood circulation</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
12:9-14	<p><b>Revere and Obey God</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• v11. The words of the wise man are ...given by one Shepherd (Veiled reference of God providing wisdom)</li> <li>• v12. “Writing of many books is endless (Amplified says “Don’t believe everything you read”), and much study is weariness to the body”– Again, extreme behaviors can be detrimental to one’s mental and physical health</li> <li>• vv13-14. <b>CONCLUSION</b> → Fear God, obey His word, for God will judge every word, thought, and deed</li> </ul>
