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INTRODUCTION

- If we know what to do such as speak kindly to our spouse, give as we should, obey good laws of the land why is it hard to do?
- Israel also had some simple choices to make choose the easy road or the hard road life or death. How hard could it be?

Passage	Comments	
Challenge to Remain Faithful		
Joshua 23:1-16	 vv3-10. Even though God ultimately won the battles for Israel, Israel still needed to fight, to kill, and to pillage and plunder as if victory depended on their efforts Principle. Even though God promises to meet all of our needs, we still need to work hard as if victory depends on us, yet trust God to deliver the results vv11-13. Be diligent to love God totally – or else God's Covenant Relationship with Israel. God established a unique covenant relationship with Israel, which is tied to the land of Israel – If Israel (which consisted of true believers and non-believers) loves God, God blesses the nation; if Israel rejects God, God destroys Israel – except for a remnant God's Covenant Relationship with Christians. Since we are adopted or grafted into Israel (as true believers) we also enjoy the eternal blessings of God. But as believers with no ties to the land of Israel, we will not experience the curses of God, but we stand to be disciplined and lose rewards if we disobey God vv14-16. "I am going the way of all the earth" Principle. We can never be so important that God can't raise someone else up to accomplish His will. Everyone dies (Moses, Joshua, Peter, Paul) with few exceptions (Enoch, Elijah, Raptured Saints) 	
24:1-13	 Challenge to Remember the Lord's Faithfulness Joshua recaps Israel's history to the eye witnesses of many of God's miracles over 40+ years Principle. Faith is based on substantiated information; Experiences may be nice, but not necessary 	
24:14-28	v14a. "Fear and Serve the Lord" – Not a paralyzing fear that leads to dysfunctional behavior, but a positive force to motivate sincere & honest service & worship v14b. Put away false gods. What are some things that distract us from loving and serving God as we should? How do we put away those false gods?	

Passage	Comments
	 v19a. "You will not be able to serve the LORD, for He is a holy God. He is a jealous God" (He is intolerant of divided affections). Even after 40+ years, many Israelites were still carrying around idols. Joshua probably sensed Israel's cheap talk v19b. "He will not remove your transgressions & sins" Principle. – We cannot presume God will forgive our sins if we are not truly repentant
24:29-33	Challenge to Leave a Positive Legacy v31. "Israel served the LORD all the days of Joshua and all the days of the elders who survived Joshua, and had known all the deeds of the LORD which He had done for Israel" Principle. If our faith is based on experiences (sight) and not on the trustworthiness of God's word, then we might be faithful only as long as we see things John 20:29 – Blessed are they who have not seen, and yet believed 2 Cor 5:7 – the Righteous live by Faith, not by Sight

CONCLUSION / APPLICATIONS

- The choice to serve God is relatively easy. The hard part is to put away on a daily basis our false gods of pleasure and greed
- Prayer, bible study, fellowship and church involvement help us to stay focused and live a life pleasing to God
