INTRODUCTION

- As we celebrate this Christmas we are one more year closer to the Lord’s 2nd coming
- It is interesting God got things rolling for the Lord’s 1st coming as His people were praying in His House of Prayer Luke 1:10

Passage	Comments
Luke 1:5-29	<p>Gabriel Foretells John’s Birth to Zechariah</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Zechariah, a Levitical priest, had the duty to burn incense in the sanctuary. Gabriel popped in to say Hi • Zechariah was “chosen by lot” signifies God even controls the roll of the dice..... Proverbs 16:33 • John the Baptist was going to be special from birth, as he was filled with the Holy Spirit while still in the womb • v10. “And the whole multitude of the people were in prayer outside at the hour of the incense offering” <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ♦ Incense was burnt twice a day in the temple, in the morning and in the evening. Incense signifies the prayers of the saints .Ex 30:7-8; Ps 141:2; Rev 8:3-4 ♦ This probably occurred on the Sabbath day, since there was such a multitude of people together; for on the weekday, there would only be the priests and Levites and some of the more devout people ♦ “I will bring them to My holy mountain & make them joyful in My house of prayer. Their burnt offerings and sacrifices will be accepted on My altar” Is 56:7
Who was Gabriel?	<p>Though commonly spoken of as an Archangel, he is not called such in Scripture. Gabriel is only mentioned 4x in the Bible. Twice in Daniel and twice in Luke as a messenger of historical news</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daniel 8:16; 9:21. Gabriel was commissioned to explain to Daniel the vision of the ram and the he-goat, and to give the prediction of the 70 weeks • Luke 1:19, 26. He announces to Zacharias the birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary the birth of Jesus • Other named angels in the Bible include Michael the Archangel (Dan 10, 12, Jud, Rev 12) and Satan/Lucifer
1:26-38	<p>Gabriel Foretells Jesus’ Birth to Mary</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To accept the Lord’s will for her life, Mary was going to be labeled a “loose woman,” an adulterer, a liar • Why didn’t Mary get disciplined for asking a question of Gabriel like Zechariah did? “How can this be?” <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ♦ Zechariah was disciplined for his lack of faith ♦ Mary asked out of curiosity – Miracle? or Natural?
1:39-45	<p>Mary Visits Elizabeth</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mary and Elizabeth may have been 1st or 2nd cousins, or possibly niece and aunt either by blood or marriage • Elizabeth realized Mary’s special pregnancy • Luke probably got these details directly from Mary

Passage	Comments
1:46-56	<p>Mary’s Praise Of God’s Goodness</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mary echoes many of the teachings from the Psalms • v48. Mary was definitely blessed by God for being chosen to raise His Son, but the Catholics went too far with venerating her beyond God’s intent. Mary was not a perpetual virgin, nor was she sinless (she needed saving), nor a co-redeemer with Christ, nor should we pray to her, nor was she assumed into Heaven
Luke 2:1-7	<p>The Birth of Jesus</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Was Jesus born in an open stable, a cave, or the basement of a relative’s house? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ♦ v7. “No room in the ‘inn” – the “inn” word here is actually misinterpreted. A better translation is “there was no room in the ‘guest room” – see Luke 22:11 & Mat 14:14 where this word [grk. kataluma] is used to describe the “guest room” where Jesus and His disciples celebrated the Passover ♦ Besides, Bethlehem was too small to have a hotel ♦ Luke actually uses the term for an inn in Luke 10:34 where he tells the story of the Good Samaritan taking a wounded man to an “inn” [grk. pandoecheion] ♦ Mary likely gave birth to Jesus in the opened lower level of a crowded in-law’s house, where animals might have been brought in for the night. She then wrapped Jesus in swaddling cloths and laid Him in a manger (an animal feeding trough used as a crib) ♦ Why such a humble beginning for the King of Kings?

CONCLUSION/APPLICATIONS

- Let us remember the real reason for the season – Jesus was born a babe in a barn to become our ransom from Hell
- And let us fight the good fight and wish everyone a very Merry Christmas
