INTRODUCTION

- Luke 24:13-35 tells the story of when the resurrected Messiah was incognito alongside 2 of His disciples on a 7 mile/2 hour walk
- v27 – “Then beginning with Moses and all the prophets He expounded the scriptures about Him” – possibly reciting many of the passages below over this 2 hour period

- The odds of only 8 of these prophecies being fulfilled in one person is at least 1x10²⁸. For any more prophecies to be fulfilled would astronomically be impossible for them to refer to any other person than Jesus Christ
- Jesus may also have explained how He was depicted in each of the Jewish mandated festivals and how He fulfilled or will fulfill each feast on its appropriate day (per Zola Levitt Ministries)

Feast	Comments (See Leviticus 23)
1. Passover (Lev 23:5)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This feast begins the 14th day of the 1st lunar month of Spring (March-April timeframe) • Jesus celebrated the Passover meal with His Apostles • We will save the meaning of Passover for another lesson
2. Unleavened Bread (Lev 23:6)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This 2nd feast is 7 days long and begins on the 15th day of the 1st lunar month – the day after Passover • Jesus, as the unleavened & sinless “bread of life”, and, as a “kernel of wheat” was beaten, crucified, pierced & buried on this day • The Jewish Passover matzoh bread is unleavened, striped (due to grilling), and pierced with a knife or fork
3. First Fruits (Lev 23:10-11)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This 3rd feast is held on the 1st Sunday (‘morrow after the Sabbath’) following Unleavened Bread to commemorate an early harvest – this could be a 1-7 day delay during the weeklong celebration of Unleavened Bread • We now call this day EASTER instead of “First Fruits” • The resurrected Christ rose on this festive occasion as the “Firstfruits”1Cor 15:23
4. Pentecost (Lev 23:15-17)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This 4th feast occurs 50 days after First Fruits, and marks the Summer harvest – and it, too, always occurs on a Sunday (‘morrow after Sabbath’) – Go figure • Lev 23:17 states that 2 wave loaves (of equal weight) baked with leaven are the Lord’s firstfruits. This subtle instruction seems to indicate 2 groups of sinful people (i.e., Jews and Gentiles) are redeemed

- More than coincidental – Jesus was crucified on Passover, buried on Unleavened Bread, raised on First Fruits, and sent the Holy Spirit on Pentecost to begin gathering in Jews and Gentiles
- But it’s not over yet – there are still 3 more Jewish Feasts, which Jesus may have explained to His 2 disciples walking to Emmaus – and we will have to cover in more detail in another lesson:

Feast	Comments (See Leviticus 23)
5. Trumpets	• This feast occurs in the 7 th lunar month, the 1 st day to commemorate the full fall harvest
6. Atonement	• This is the only solemn day of the year, 10 th day, 7 th month
7. Tabernacles	• Finally, on the 15 th day of the 7 th month, the Feast of Tabernacles finishes the year where Jews build temporary shelters to worship in
