INTRODUCTION

- Peter was writing to a church who lived in a pagan culture which devalued the need for a man to be faithful in his marriage, and this society accepted concubines and prostitution as common practices
- Though the Bible does a GREAT job telling us what makes a godly marriage, it is hard to find some good examples, even in the Bible
- A few marriages that stand out as good examples are:
 Adam & Eve before they sinned; Abraham & Sarah before Hagar;
 Solomon & his Shulamite bride before all his other women;
 Mary & Joseph; and Aquila & Priscilla
- In this section Peter conveys some powerful principles for married couples to follow if they truly want a long, blessed union

	Wives – "Be Submitting to Your Own Husbands"		
1Peter 3:1-2	 The probable context is a wife has recently accepted Christ and has joined the church – but her husband remains a pagan – so how should a believing wife act? This statement "be submitting" is not a command, but a participial phrase ('ing') emphasizing "voluntary" submittal to an unbelieving husband BUT, is this statement with or without conditions? What if the husband is abusive? see Mat 18:15-17 A parallel passage is 1 Corinthians 7:10-16 Criticism & nagging are ineffective tools of evangelism, but Godly behavior accomplishes much for the Kingdom (actions speak louder than words) End result → An unbelieving spouse either accepts Christ or becomes less antagonistic toward Christianity 		
More Thoughts on Sub- mission	 1) Submission does not mean inferiority; 2) Submission is to be given willingly; and 3) Submission does not tolerate brutality or sinfulness For other commands to submit to husbands, see Eph 5:22 & Col 3:18. These passages emphasize willful, joyful obedience – not obedience out of compulsion Do things God's way and we can expect godly results 		
3:3-4	Clothing and Makeup Are Optional Some Christians use this passage to restrict the use of makeup and even to dictate the style of clothes Peter's intent was not to establish a dress code, but to convey that something had a higher priority over one's physical appearance – and that was for the inner person to be predictably gentle, humble, and honorable – qualities which God enjoys working with How much does a woman's physical appearance play into manipulating people – especially men? Peter's position was less is better – simplicity, not extravagance – character, not sexuality
