## INTRODUCTION


- Paul meets the more noble Bereans who examined the Scriptures daily to see if Paul was speaking the truth about God.
- What minimal facts do we need to make a sound decision?
   □ Do we need 100% of the facts? □ 80%? □ 50%? □ 10%?
- Remember. Faith has an element of doubt, otherwise it would be called Fact and not Faith! Fortunately, our faith is not a blind faith.
