INTRODUCTION

- Historical Note. Roman Emperor Claudius (aka, Tiberius Claudius Caesar Augustus Germanicus) reigned from 41-54 AD. Claudius expelled Jews from Rome in 49 AD for creating disturbances because of Christ (see Acts 18:2). After Claudius' death, Jews began to return to Rome under the new Caesar, Nero, who was Claudius' grandnephew and adopted son. Nero reigned from 54-68 AD. Paul was heading for Rome ~60 AD and would spend 2 years there.

THE REST OF THE STORY

- Paul was eventually released after 2 years in Rome. Tradition says Paul made it to Spain, but eventually ended up back in Rome.
- The New Testament does not say when or how Paul died, but some early church fathers state he was beheaded by Nero. The date of Paul's death is believed to have occurred after the Great Fire of Rome in July 64 AD but before the last year of Nero's reign in 68 AD.
