**INTRODUCTION**


- A lot happens in this single chapter: God introduces himself as "God Almighty"; Abram gets a new name; Abraham loses an uncomely part of his body; and he tries to change history by asking God to compromise on one of His promises.

Here is another interesting aspect of the Hebrew Language:	
<b>Letter Name</b>	<b>Trans-iteration</b> <b>Early</b>
<b>Aleph</b>	A    א
<b>Bevt</b>	B    ב
<b>A: Symbol of an OX = Strength</b>	
<b>B: Symbol of a HOUSE</b>	
<b>Combine AB or Abba → Strength of Household → Father</b>	
<b>Then consider the last letter of the Hebrew alphabet, "T" or "†" and you have the symbol of the Cross... ...So, from the beginning (AB) to the end (†), or Alpha to Omega (in Greek) you have →→→ Father to Savior</b>	
17:9-14, 23-27	<b>Covenant of Circumcision</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• God had man enter into the covenant by offering a special part of his own body, and no part could be better spared. It is a secret part of the body; for the true circumcision is that of the heart: and this honor God bestowed upon an uncomely part (source: Matthew Henry Commentary)</li> <li>• Women inherited the blessings of the Jewish covenant by familial relationships with a man (father or spouse)</li> </ul>
17:17-22	<b>Abraham Laughs at God's Promise</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Abraham tries to make a compromise with God (have Ishmael be the inheritor) – But God had other plans for Ishmael, for from him came many Arab/Muslim nations</li> <li>• Abraham's passivity was a blessing and a curse <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>♦ <b>World's Blessings.</b> He obeyed God without hesitation, he received honor in the Hall of Fame twice (<a href="#">Heb 11:8,17</a>) and he became a blessing to all nations <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. He moved his family on command..... <a href="#">Gen 12:1</a></li> <li>2. He circumcised himself, family, &amp; servants ..... <a href="#">v23</a></li> <li>3. He offered up Isaac as a sacrifice ..... <a href="#">Gen 22</a></li> <li>4. From his loins, came the Savior of the world</li> </ol> </li> <li>♦ <b>World's Problems.</b> He also obeyed his wife without hesitation, got her maid pregnant and sent her off into the desert at the command of his wife &amp; with God's consent, which allowed Ishmael to fulfill God's purpose for him, who would be in contention with others and even with his own brothers (as we see with Arabs today) ..... <a href="#">Gen 16:12</a></li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Good Traditions Gone Awry	Like Baptism, circumcision was meant to be an external sign of the need to have an internal change of heart toward God. But due to man's sinful nature, those symbols have, over time, morphed into other things: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) One MUST be Baptized and/or Circumcised to be saved</li> <li>2) Some African nations practice female circumcision, which is nothing more than mutilation</li> </ol>
