Isaiah 40:1-31	 Our God Created ALL Things and Never Grows Tired v2. God gave Israel double punishment for her sins That doesn't sound fair, does it? Doesn't God deal fairly or equitably with all (e.g., eye for eye) (Ps 9:8; 75:2; 98:9)? Some suffered "sevenfold" for their sins .Gen 4:15; Pr 6:31 and those who spend an eternity in Hell do so for committing one unforgivable sin, blaspheme of the HS (i.e., rejection of Jesus Christ and His atoning work) How do we answer skeptics with this apparent inequity? Consider this. Severe punishment (be it 2x, 7x, or 10x) is often dispensed to get some sinners to think twice before sinning the next time (Prov 22:15; 23:13; 29:15). Wicked, foolish sinners however, never learn their lessons even if they are shown kindness (Is 26:10) or if they are harshly "crushed in a crucible" (Pro 27:22). And those who end up in Hell would rather be there for an eternity than stand before a Holy and Righteous God for a minute John 5:40 v3. Prophesy of John the Baptist v5. All flesh shall see God's glory. Possibly alludes to Christ's return on a white horse in Rev 19:11-16 v8. God's word stands forever. Ultimately true, but in our sin-soaked world, even Christians disobey the speed limit (Rom 13:1-4) and suffer broken marriages (Mat 5:32) v12-17. More tough truths: Who is smart enough to instruct God? What can God be compared to? All nations before him are as NOTHING v22. God sits upon the circle of the earth. This passage defeats the flat earth society of yesteryear vv28-31. God, creator of the earth, does not grow tired. Instead, God gives his strength and stamina to those who need it, when they need it 		
41:1-29	ov4. I am the First and the Last – I am HERev 1:17; 22:13 vv10-16. FEAR NOT – FOR I AM WITH YOU Those who harm Israel will perish, be ashamed, dishonored v14. Do Not Fear, You Worm Jacob. The MSG Bible says, "Do you feel like a lowly worm, Jacob? I will help you" IOW, Jacob/Israel may be small, weak, insignificant, but God is their true Deliverer. Does this also apply to us? vv17-20 – Why does God wait sooo long to answer some of our most urgent prayers, even to the point where tongues are parched from waiting for life-sustaining water? vv20, Answer: To remove the probability of coincidence

Promise of protection for God's chosen ones, Israel's Remnant, from fire & flood Ultimately and spiritually, this is true, BUT from a temporal perspective, many believers have died in abject poverty (Lazarus, widow with 2 mites), others died a martyr's deaths (Apostles); Look what happen to God's own Son. v7. We have all been specifically created for God's glory How do we bring Him glory? By obedience Rev 16:9 How do we bring Him shame? 1Cor 6:5; 11:22; 15:34 v12. Israel (and us) are His witnesses. Are we witnessing? vv22-24. God's own people (Israel) got tired of Him and burdened Him with their sins. Remember, not all Israel are Israel	
44:1-28	I Am the First and the Last. There is No God Besides Me .v6 vv1-5. LISTEN UP ISRAEL – Better days are coming for their children v8. Take Note – You Are My Witnesses (How many times does God have to repeat this?) Are we witnessing yet? vv9-20. Idolatry is the fall of everyone who ends up in Hell. They prefer to worship anyone and anything besides their creator, God vv18-19. God blinds those who are blind toward Him v22. God still stretches out His Hand to His people v24. And God repeats for the 13th time He is the CREATOR Do you think this repetition is important? Should this be a part of our witnessing approach in our evolutionary society? ABSOLUTELY
