## INTRODUCTION

- How many times have we asked our kids pointed questions with the intent to shake them out of their stupor? Examples:
  - ✓ "What in the world were you thinking?"
  - ✓ "How hard is it for you to take out the garbage?"
  - ✓ "If your friends jumped off a bridge would you do it too?"
  - ✓ "Would you like your face slapped off into the middle of next week?"
- By the time we get to Jeremiah chapter 15, 99 questions have been asked, and God asked more than 60 of them.
- God's questions to His wayward children included:
  ✓ How have I wronged you?
  ✓ Why do you harm yourself?
  ✓ Where are your gods when you need them?
  ✓ 2:28
  ✓ Why do you always try to please yourself?
  ✓ 2:33
  ✓ Why do you work so hard to change yourself?
  ✓ Why do you keep dwelling on vain thoughts?
  ✓ What are your plans if things go from bad to worse?
  ✓ How can I forgive you for such atrocities?
  ✓ Why do you see my house as a den of thieves? IOW, why
  - do you make excuses for not going to church?......7:11 ✓ Why don't you get back up after you fall down?......8:4 ✓ Can the leopard change his spots? IOW, can the wicked really change for the better? NOPE! They refuse ......13:23
- We can only get a sense of gloom & doom is on the horizon
