INTRODUCTION

- Jesus raises Lazarus from the grave, which is the 7th and last sign recorded by John
- Scripture records **10 resurrections**, presumably all redeemed individuals (half of them were children, one was a Canaanite boy)
 1. Elijah raised son of a Sidonian (non-Jew)..... [1Ki 17:17-24](#)
 2. Elisha raised son of a Shunammite [2Ki 4:32-37](#)
 3. Elisha raised man who touched his bones..... [2Ki 13:20, 21](#)
 4. Jesus raised Jairus' daughter [Lu 8:51-55](#)
 5. Jesus raised the son of a widow [Lu 7:11-15](#)
 6. Jesus raised Lazarus after 4 days [John 11:41, 42](#)
 7. Jesus resurrected Himself [John 10:18](#)
 8. God raised up numerous saints [Matthew 27:52](#)
 9. Peter resurrected Tabitha/Dorcas [Acts 9:39-42](#)
 10. Paul resurrected young Eutychus [Acts 20:9, 10](#)

Passage	Comments
John 11:1-20	<p>Setting the Stage for a Supernatural Miracle</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • v15. Jesus said <i>"and I am glad for your sakes that I was not there (when Lazarus died), so that you may believe"</i> – Jesus was setting the stage for a supernatural miracle that could not be construed as happenstance, subjective, or coincidental
11:21-27	<p>Would've, Could've, Should've...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • v21. <i>"Lord, if you had been here..."</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ♦ Martha presents a "what-if" scenario. Are we locked into a one-size solution for everything? YES & NO. ♦ Our gender, our IQ, our parents, race, & nationality, our birthdate, and our genetic dispositions to catch various diseases were determined without our input ♦ Our choice of career, spouse, even our day of death are not fixed, but have a range of possibilities based on sinful or righteous circumstances, prayers, etc. ♦ Of special note is our eternal state is determined both by God's will and our will • v27. Mary gets it. <i>"Yes, Lord, I believe You are the Christ, the Son of God..."</i> – What convinced Mary?
11:28-37	<p>The Savior's Compassion</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • v35. "Jesus wept" – Jesus exhibited human traits 100% • Some Christians believe that since God is the same yesterday, today, and forever, the compassion Jesus exhibited to the sick of His day is still available for us today – Therefore, supernatural healings and miracles, such as raising the dead, should still be possible • This is a lesson in itself. Deuteronomy 4:9 depicts God suspending supernatural miracles without suspending His compassion for His people. God commanded the generation of the Exodus to remember the miracles of old & convey them to the next generation who would not experience them – BUT God is still the same GOD

Passage	Comments
11:38-44	<p>The Savior's Power</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Did God cause Lazarus to succumb to death just to gain honor? • v39. <i>"...Lord, by this time there will be a stench..."</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ♦ The Jews believed that after a person's death, the spirit remained near the body for 3 days, trying to reenter. But after 4 days, as decay began to sit in, the spirit left with no chance for resuscitation ♦ Lazarus' resurrection at this stage would be akin to raising someone after their embalming – a creative miracle possible by God and God alone ♦ Satan can copy many of God's wonders (with God's permission, of course), but all of Satan's healings & miracles are called "lying wonders" for the purpose of deception.....2Thes 2:9; Rev 16:14; 18:23; 19:20
11:45-57	<p>The Savior's Popularity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • vv45-46. Split crowd. Some chose to believe in Christ, while others chose to rat on him to the Pharisees • vv47-57. Conspiracy to Kill the Son of God. The Jews had a zeal for God, but not according to knowledge (Romans 10:2). The Message Bible says <i>"...they are doing everything exactly backwards."</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ♦ What misplaced zeal can we be accused of having?

CONCLUSION/APPLICATIONS

- There will be 5 more resurrections in the future. Which one will we be a part of?
 1. **Rapture:** Christ will make a partial appearance and "take up" the Christians into heaven ([1Thes 4:16](#)), sparing them from approximately 7 years of tribulation on the earth. ([Rev 6-19](#))
 2. **Tribulation-era saints** and O.T. saints at the beginning of the millennium ([Rev 20:4](#), [Is 26:19](#), [Dan 12:1](#))
 3. **Company of saints** after the millennium ([1Cor. 15:22-23](#))
 4. **The Antichrist:** The only confirmed non-believer seemingly raised from the dead ([Rev 13:3](#))
 5. Finally, resurrection of all the wicked ([Rev. 20:11](#))

NEXT WEEK: John 12:1-50. Jesus gets His feet washed, He strolls into Jerusalem seated on a donkey to fulfill scripture, He responds to hearing about some Greeks looking to chat with Him, the crowd is spooked after hearing a voice from Heaven, He foretells His own death, and He performed more signs among the people – yet many still chose not to believe in Him.
