INTRODUCTION

- In these last few chapters of Leviticus, we see that if Israel would obey God's commandments they would be blessed with prosperity beyond measure (no poor in the land, no sickness in the land, and no crime in the land). BUT if they do not obey they will be punished 7 times more for their sins until they repent.
- This begs a question: If God is a just God why would He punish Israel or anyone 7 times more for their sins?

Leviticus 23:1-44	 Major Jewish Holidays See table below. The Jewish calendar is based on a 30-day lunar cycle, with 360 days (12 months) per year, and a leap year having 13-months occurring 7 times in a 19-year cycle Most countries use the solar-based 365-day Gregorian calendar, which has a leap year having 1 extra day in the month of February occurring every 4 years v23. Principle of Not Reaping the Corners. This is a very appropriate principle even for NT believers since it is a means to help others. E.g., don't be a workaholic, but leave some hours for others to work. Or don't run your employer into the ground by draining the budget. vv29-32. Why was an annual Fast a do or die issue? Consider this. If someone wasn't willing to humble themselves before their God one day each year to repent of their sins and intentionally seek His face above even food, then their heart was nothing short of evil & idolatrous and, therefore, worthy of death.

24:1-16	 Harsh Penalties - Do They Fit the Crime vv10-16. Why stone someone for cussing? Is God a vindictive, malevolent, egomaniac as atheists claim? Commandments 1-7 did carry the death penalty Remember. These commandments and their consequences were part of a one-of-a-kind covenantal agreement between God and Israel and Israel's succeeding generations to make them a holy people – set apart for God's purpose. AlsoGod sometimes invoked a punishment only once as an example for others to beware & behave 		
One Time Occurrences of Severe Discipline Noted in the Bible	 Those who committed idolatry in violation of Commandments #1 & #2 were slain		
24:17-23	 Law of Retaliation / Retribution (Eye for Eye) The penalty was to fit the crime, not to exceed it Per Gill's commentary, Eye for an Eye was more of a euphemism for equitable justice by "pecuniary" or monetary recompense. This was not Talibanism gone wild. E.g., if 2 men were fighting and one broke the other's leg, it does society no good to break the leg of the 2nd man, for society would then have 2 handicap men that 2 families would be burdened to pick up some slack. Instead, it was understood that a valuation would be placed on the leg for the 2nd man to provide some kind of equitable compensation in time and/or money. Valuations of individuals are address in Chapter 27, next page. Always consider the "whole counsel of God"

	Sabbatic Year (every 7 years) and 50th Year of Jubilee
25:1-55	 The land was to remain fallow every 7th and 50th year vv8-18. Every 50 years Israel would re-baseline property ownership and eliminate all debt. The Benefit → Israel would live securely in their land if they would only heed God's statutes The Jews haven't celebrated the Year of Jubilee since the Assyrian conquest of the northern tribes, ~600BCE. If there are no defined Jewish tribes living in their allocated land, there is nothing to restore. The next year of Jubilee may be a millennial event vv20-22. God would provide 3 years of food in the 6th year to feed the nation during the 7th year of Sabbath, the 8th year of replanting, and the 9th year to replenish And for the Year of Jubilee, God would provide 4 years of food in the 48th year to feed the nation in the 49th year (a Sabbath year), the 50th year of Jubilee, the 51st year to replant, and the 52nd year to replenish No other nation has ever had such a Land Covenant
Consider this about the Land of Israel	 The Promised Land Plays Prominently in the Bible It is first promised in Gen 15 (~2000 years after Gen 1) And we see the Jews residing in the land at the close of human history in Revelations (~4000 years later) Yet, the Israelites only possess and rule the Promised Land of Israel for about 450 years, suffering 3 major deportations (Assyrians, Babylonians, and Romans) and they have only recently been back in the land for a mere 100 years after being gone almost 2000 years 1917 – Balfour Declaration re-established Israel as a nation (calculated as a 50th Jubilee yr of restoration) https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Balfour_Declaration 1967 – 6-day war restored Jerusalem to Israel (another Jubilee year of restoration) https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Six-Day_War 2017 – Keep your eyes focused on Israel, since 2017 is another year of Jubilee https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Jubilee_(biblical)
26:1-39	 Obedience → Blessings Disobedience → Punishment vv1-13. If the Jews fully obeyed God's commands they would have plenty of food, no threat of war, no slavery, no poverty, and no sickness Truly, Israel could have been a testimony to the world of God's love, mercy, goodness, and holiness Gen 12:1-3 Does God's promise for utopia still exist today? Consider this. Even during the Millennial reign of Christ, there will be death (Isaiah 65:20), divorces (Ezek 44:22), and nations rising up against Jesus even as He rules with a rod of iron (Rev 19:15). The heart of unregenerated man never changes. We will not see a perfect world till after the Millennial reign of Christ and we, the elect, enter the New Heavens and New Earth and the wicked are cast into Hell vv14-39. BUT, if Israel disobeys, God has other plans: vv14-17. War, death, disease, famine is inevitable vv18, 21, 24, 28. God promises to punish them 7 times (a metaphor for complete judgment), including with the plague (or rampant communicable diseases) vv19-20. The land will not produce enough food v22. Wild animals will further reduce the population v29. Israel would eat their kids to survive. vv30-39 God abhors His own people so much He destroys most of them & scatters the rest to be enslaved Discontinuation of the produce of the population of them & scatters the rest to be enslaved

27:1-34	 The Politically Correct Answer: God is a just God and everyone is equal at the foot of the Cross, so everyone gets the same prize The Not-so-Politically Correct Answer: Recall, the Lord spoke directly to Moses. No explanation was given for why males in all age groups were weighted more than their female counterparts by 33% to 50% (His ways and thoughts are not our ways and thoughts). We can only speculate in an agrarian society, men, being physically stronger, were given proportionately more worth. Sample Vow: A farmer prays, "O Lord, our crops have failed the past 3 years, but if You give us a good year, I vow to give You not only Your tithe but also my oldest son" (or the value of the oldest son) v29. Some people groups were marked for genocide for their perverseness or cruelties. No mercy was to be extended. For example → the Amalekites Deut 25:17-19; 1Sam 15:2-3 vv30-34. God is flexible – When someone had to withhold paying their tithe due to economic or personal reasons, they were required to add a 20% penalty. Why such a high interest rate? Consider this: If the interest rate was lower, more people would be enticed to withhold their tithe for frivolous reasons. 		

CONCLUSION / APPLICATIONS / CONSIDERATIONS

- God prefers to bless His people with unbelievable joy and peace, but He
 is prepared to coax His people to repentance by implementing directive
 punishments should they stray. So, obey to position yourself for blessings.
- Many of the laws within Leviticus may seem archaic and non-applicable to us 21st Century Christians, but be aware that the Levitical priests shall never lack a man to offer burnt offerings before the Lord (Jeremiah 33:18; Ezek 44), at least while the current earth is in existence (Jer 33:19-22)
