	 vv29-31. Moses tried to convince Hobab (son-in-law or brother-in-law) to stay and help direct him possibly to safe and plenteous watering holes and away from dangerous communities Why did Moses place his trust in a man and not in the Cloud or in God's attending Angel? <u>Exodus 14:19; 23:20; 23:23; 32:34</u> God did not provide Moses with every answer. Jethro, for example, provided Moses with management advice (divide the people into 10s and 50s, and 100s, and 1,000s – Exodus 18)

11:1-35	 v1. God's fire consumed some in the outskirts of the camp The complainers (possible foreigners residing with the unclean in the outskirts) quickly enticed others to join in their bickering. Complaining is contagious, disruptive, and even dangerous. vv4, 15. Complainers were greedy & Moses wanted to die Trying to please those who are never happy is wearisome vv17, 25. God's remedy – Share work with othersvv19-20. And be careful what you pray for, you may get it along with leanness of soulPsalms 106:15 v23. Is God's power limited? Is anything too hard for Him? vv31-33. There was enough quail to cover the ground 3 feet deep in a radius of a day's journey (~20-25 miles all around) – and God struck the greedy possibly with food poisoning? WHY? 		
12:1-16	 Mixed Marriages Addressed A mixed marriage was not the problem? What was it? Israel's journey into the Promised Land was delayed until Miriam's healing and restoration was completed God's people can't move forward till sin is fixed Has church growth been stagnant for years? Maybe there is sin in the camp that needs to be addressed. Other reasons for churches not growing? Sign of the times? Weak Sheep? Poor Music? Poor Programs? Other? 		

CONCLUSION/APPLICATIONS

- Shepherds always need to discern between valid and biblical pushback from members within the church from sinful grumbling; and handle each case accordingly.
