15:1-36	Sacrifices for Sins  More Bumt, Freewill, Grain, Drink, and Peace Offerings  vv15-16. Repeat of having 1 statue for the Jews & believing aliens  v24-30. Even unintentional or accidental sins were to be accounted for. Ignorance of the Law is no excuse!  v30-36. However, intentional sins are equated to blasphemy  Recall blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is unpardonable  Gathering firewood on the Sabbath called for the death penalty  Recall the Sabbath was a Covenant God made only with the Jews, and it was to the death			
	Introduction to a Key Piece of Wardrobe – The Prayer Shawl			
15:37-41 A GOLD NUGGET Passage	<ul> <li>The Shawl was made as a visual reminder of God and His Law</li> <li>Blue thread – skyward focused on God. One thread of each of the four corner tassels was to be a deep blue color to remind them of their duty to keep the law</li> <li>Jewish Tradition. There were 39 windings in each tassel, which equates to the numerical value of the Hebrew words "the Lord is One" or Yahweh</li> <li>There are 613 knots in every one of these tassels corresponding to the 613 laws in the Law of Moses! 365 were probations – "Thy shall NOT" and 248 were affirmations – "Thy shall"!</li> <li>The Jewish men wore this garment called a, "Talith", aka Jewish Prayer-Shawl, all the time, not just at prayer. "Talith" contains two Hebrew words; TAL meaning tent and ITH meaning little. Thus, each man had his own "Little Tent"</li> <li>Acts 18:3. The apostle Paul was a Jewish Pharisee, but also a "tentmaker". Many believe he made Taliths or Prayer-Shawls, not tents to live in</li> <li>Matthew 6:6. Enter into your prayer closet – for the Jew this occurred when the shawl was pulled over their head</li> </ul>			
	<ul> <li>Matthew 23:5. Pharisees considered the tassels special marks of sanctity and sought to enlarge them to display their righteousness</li> <li>Note. Since the four windings on the four corner tassels correspond to the Holy Name of God, when holding or viewing or touching the tassels we are embracing symbolically the entire Word of God, all the commands of God, and the Name of God, so we are in essence, embracing God, Himself</li> <li>Mark 5:25-34 – A woman with a bleeding disorder grabs the</li> </ul>			
	tassels of Jesus' shawl, believing by faith she would be touching God and God would respond by touching her  Revelations 19:11-16 – The rider's name is on his thigh  The "Greek" mindset imagines a tattoo or something similar on the thigh of Jesus when he returns as "King of Kings, and Lord of Lords". The Hebrew mindset sees something more specific: Since, the knots of the tassels on the four corners of a Talith spell out the name of Yahweh, therefore, while riding a white horse on His return to earth, the braids/knots/tassels/fringes of Yeshua's Talith (prayer shawl) rest on one or both of His upper legs allowing



If we are so blessed why do we always want more, and we want it now?</li> <li>Korah failed to factor in God's sovereignty (God can pick &amp; choose things at will). The 3 clans of Levites (Gershornites, Kohathites, Merarites) shall perform their duties to support the 4th clan – the sons of Aaron (the priests) without jealousy vv24-28. Israel's tithes supported the Levites, and the tithes of the Levites supported the Priests	
19:1-22	The Ashes of the Red Heifer  vv1-9. The "unblemished" red heifer was slaughtered outside the camp, then its blood was sprinkled on the tabernacle tent, and its ashes were used to cleanse people ceremoniously from various impurities  Jesus was crucified outside of Jerusalem and His blood makes us whiter than snow	
20:1-29	word Grumbling Leads to Moses' Biggest Failure     v8. God told Moses to "speak to the rock before their eyes, that it may yield its water"     vv11-12. BUT Moses "struck the rock twice" and God said "Because you did not believe me and treat me as holyyou will not enter the promised land"     We must always be on our guard to protect our testimony before the world. If we fail to do so, we won't lose our salvation, but we will lose out on blessings in this world and rewards in Heaven
