	 Answer. Scripture tells us that God wanted to "utterly" destroy the 7 nations of Canaan (the Canaanites, Amorites, Hittites, Perizzites, Hivites, Jebusites, Girgashites) with no pity, for their horrific sins of immorality, homosexuality, child sacrifice, bestiality, and sorcery, (cf Lev 18; Deut 7:16; 9:4; 12:31; 18:14 20:16,17; Josh 6:21; 11:20) v55. If the Jews failed to drive out the inhabitants of the land the consequence would be the influence to leave God and chase after false gods and immorality v56and God would be forced to annihilate His own people. DID THE JEWS LISTEN TO GOD? Another tough aspect of this passage, "What I plan to do to them, I will do to you," is the principle that God sends wrath on those who love the wicked and hate the Lord	 v7. The Levites were allocated 48 cities within Israel. Recall Jacob's blessings on Simeon and Levi"I will scatter them throughout Israel"Gen 49:5-7 Simeon was scattered within Judah, and Levi inherited cities throughout Israel Joshua 19:1 v6. 6 of those 48 cities would be cities of refuge where falsely accused killers could reside so they would not be killed by a relative (blood avenger) of the slain: 3 cities east of the Jordan river and 3 cities west of the Jordan see Joshua 20:7-9 and map v19. The blood avenger was allowed to deliver justice (they did not have sheriffs in those days) v30. However, no person shall be put to death on the testimony of only one witness (a timeless principle) v33. Blood pollutes the land and must be atoned for by the one who sheds it (i.e., life for life)
